Step 1 - List Your Target Courses and Universities

Write down 2-3 course + university combinations you're realistically considering. It's fine if this list changes later - the point is to start with something concrete.

Fill this in from each university's official CUET-based admission page or information bulletin - not from guesswork or what a friend told you.

Step 2 - Check the Overlaps

Look across your rows above. Which domain subjects, languages, or the General Test show up more than once? Those are strong candidates for your final 5 - they keep multiple course options open at the same time.

Step 3 - Lock In Your Final 5 Subjects (Minimum 3, Maximum 5)

Before You Finalise - Checklist

- I checked at least 2-3 target universities' official CUET admission pages, not just one.
- I did not assume my domain subject choice must match my Class 12 board stream - I verified the actual requirement for each course.
- I picked subjects that appear in more than one of my target course rows, where possible.
- I've noted the registration window so I don't miss the deadline once NTA releases it.
